Organisation of the Programme

The Conference Programme consists of three types of sessions: Special Plenary Sessions, Themed Plenary Sessions, and, following the Themed Plenary Session, a series of concurrent Workshops/Symposia. The Special Plenary Sessions feature various issues of interest and have varied with the Biennial World Conferences. The Themed Plenary Sessions have remained a constant over the three Biennial World Conferences although the particular issues presented vary. There are five broad Biennial Conference themes that span health, education, justice and other relevant sectors:

- **Theme 1.** Research on the Promotion of Mental Health and the Prevention of Mental Disorders Worldwide;
- **Theme 2.** Evidence-based Programmes, Policies, and Principles of Effective Promotion and Prevention;
- **Theme 3.** International Exchange of Research Outcomes, Programmes, Policies and Guidelines to Stimulate Implementation, Recognizing the Need for Cultural Variations and Adaptation;
- **Theme 4.** Advocacy, Policy-making and Organizational Models which Facilitate Promotion and Prevention Programmes; and
- **Theme 5.** Improved Training to Increase Knowledge and Expertise in the Design and Implementation of Promotion and Prevention Programmes.

Each Themed Plenary Session is followed by concurrent Workshops and/ or Symposia in which abstracts selected for that theme will be presented. The Workshops/Symposia are organized for each theme along one of five lifespan tracks as shown below. Generally, each Themed Plenary has at least five Workshops/Symposiums, each of which features three or four paper presentations. In some cases, the numbers of abstracts selected for a lifespan track required additional, concurrent Workshops/Symposia to accommodate them all.
